Pastor Dwaine's Column

And Jesus taught them many things in parables, saying: "Listen! A sower went out to sow... And as he sowed, some seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Let anyone with ears, listen!"

Matthew 13: 3, 8

I spent some time at my parent's farm a few days ago. It's a fun time of the year to walk through the fields there. Much of the corn stood three feet above my head, and the soybean plants were thick and lush around my knees. God willing, in a month or two those fields will produce a harvest, sixty or hundredfold – just like the fields in Jesus' parable.

Of course, it hasn't been an easy the year for farming – at least in that part of the state. A late spring held up planting for weeks. Flooding rains drowned young plants in the low lying areas. Of course, that was on top of the usual perils of bugs, weeds and storms. But amazingly enough, despite all the obstacles, a bountiful harvest will still come. And that's what keeps farmers planting their crops each year. Like the sower in Jesus' story, they know that there is a miraculous power in the seeds they plant. A power to grow and flourish and bring a great harvest.

So why my words about farming and planting seeds? It's because of what's happening in our congregation this month. When Jesus speaks of the sower planting seeds – he's not talking about soybeans or corn. No, what the sower plants is God's word of promise. His seed is the good news that we are loved by God, that our sins are forgiven, that we are named as daughters and sons in God's family. That's the seed the sower sows. But it's also the seed we plant here at Resurrection.

Now, of course the planting of that message goes on year round. But in the coming weeks, we are even more intentional about sowing those seeds. Sunday and Wednesday Church School are getting geared up, youth and confirmation programs will be renewed, adult education opportunities will be offered, invitations to serve those in need will be given. In all those ways, along with our regular weekly worship, seeds are sown that grow into an abundant faith – the kind of faith that produces a harvest of love, service and hope.

Now there are obstacles to that faith. Just like farmers face challenges to bringing in a harvest, lots of things get in the way of the relationship we have with God. Cares, concerns, and simple busyness all can conspire choke off the fruit that God seeks to grow in our lives. But as farmers know, and as Jesus teaches in his parable of the sower; there is a solution to this dilemma: Keep planting the seed. Be present in those places where God's message of love and grace is shared. That's how faith grows. That's how a harvest comes.

So, in the coming weeks I hope I will see you here at Resurrection as God plants seeds among us. It will happen at worship, around the Lord's Table, in Church School and confirmation classes. It will take place each time we open our Bibles and gather for study or prayer. Because that's how God grows our faith and produces a harvest in us. May we all be that good soil which produces thirty, sixty and even hundred-fold, as God's love bears fruit in our lives.

Psalm 66:1-3

New Member Sunday

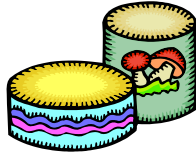

What to bring: Medicare or insurance card. If no insurance, cost is \$29.99 by check, credit card, or cash.

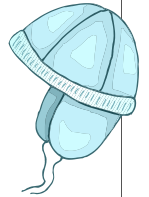

Saint Joseph Community Food Shelf Needs



Thanks to all of you who have generously donated this summer. Item donations always decline during the summer months and your contributions are truly appreciated. The

local food shelf served 65 families this past July which is 18 more families and 120 people more than were served in July 2010.

Nonperishable food items, personal and household items are always in demand. Several items are currently not needed: tomato soup, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles, and canned corn.

Suggestions for donations include: staples--flour, sugar, brown sugar, powdered sugar, and salt. Canned fruits and vegetables, peanut butter, jellies and jams, muffin mixes, pancake/waffle mixes, and rice.

Personal and household products needed include: shampoo, conditioner, soap-bar and liquid, toothbrushes, toothpaste, shaving supplies, feminine products, diapers, dish-washing soap, laundry detergent, toilet cleaner, household cleaners, paper towels, and toilet paper.

All items can be dropped off in the grocery cart that is located in the narthex. Cash donations can be written to RLC with "food shelf" written on the memo line and can be left in the offering baskets or dropped off at the church office.

If you have an abundance of garden items that you would like to share, please contact Kathy in the church office.

Your support is appreciated by those who utilize the services of the food shelf.

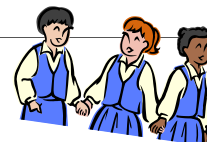

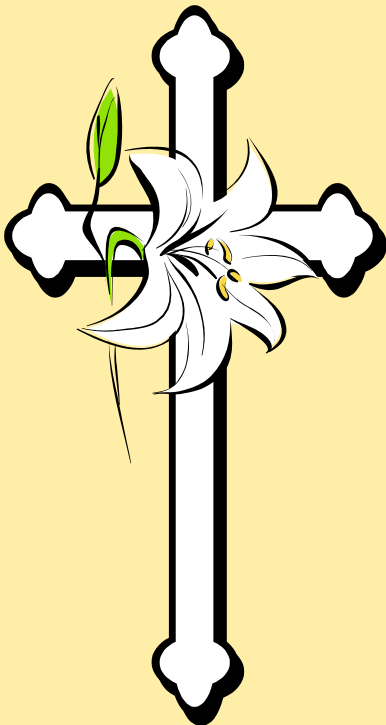
